The Fox News Channel College Challenge is a video news package competition. All teams must be signed up by December 8th, 2011 with entries submitted online by February 9th, 2012 (or postmarked by February 16th, 2012) The entries will be judged by a panel from Fox News Channel who are integral in the newsgathering, production, and presentation of news programming.

The winning team will receive:

- \$10,000 scholarship to be shared amongst the winning team
- \$10,000 grant to the winning University
- Trip to NYC (students and Professor)
- Interview for a job (seniors) or internship (juniors) at Fox News Channel

Winning entries, students and Professors have appeared on morning and daytime Fox News Channel programs. Past winners include University of Missouri, Ball State University, University of Hawaii, California State - Fullerton, Boston University, University of Georgia, University of Texas – Austin, and Indiana University-Bloomington.

The Fox News Channel College Challenge is designed to advance student's ability to gather, write and present the news. It showcases their ability in interviewing, editing and assembly of newscasts while working as a team to create a balanced news piece and can be a great way to complement your curriculum.
