Methodology

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll is based on live telephone interviews with a national sample of 913 registered voters, and was conducted March 14-16, 2011 in the evenings.

Landline and cell phone telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means that phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of error of $\pm 3\%$. Results among subgroups have larger sampling errors, including: Democrats (n = 356) $\pm 5\%$; Republicans (n = 334) $\pm 5\%$; Independents (n = 202) $\pm 7\%$.
